Flu shots offered Nov. 3

Flu shots will be offered on campus this year for all employees, including full-and part-time faculty and staff.

The shots will be given on Tuesday, Nov. 3 from noon to 2 p.m. in Room M106.

To participate, you must sign up by Oct 30. To register for a flu shot, see Linda Antons or Judy Spence at the first floor receptionist desk.

The cost is \$20, payable when you receive the shot. KCC's insurance policy does not include flu shots within the plan.

As clarification, neither students nor the general public are included in this event. It is for employees only.

H1N1 vaccination information

BlueCross BlueShield of Illinois will cover the administration of the vaccine for the H1N1 flu virus.

Moreover, it will cover the administration fee without applying it to affected members' deductibles, co-insurance, office visit co-pays or wellness maximums. Members who receive the vaccination from BlueCross BlueShield of Illinois network providers will be covered for 100 percent of costs. Those who use providers outside the BlueCross BlueShield of Illinois network will be subject to out-of-network rates.

It is important to understand that these benefits are subject to the vaccine's availability. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention is working with local health departments to ensure the following populations receive the vaccine first:
