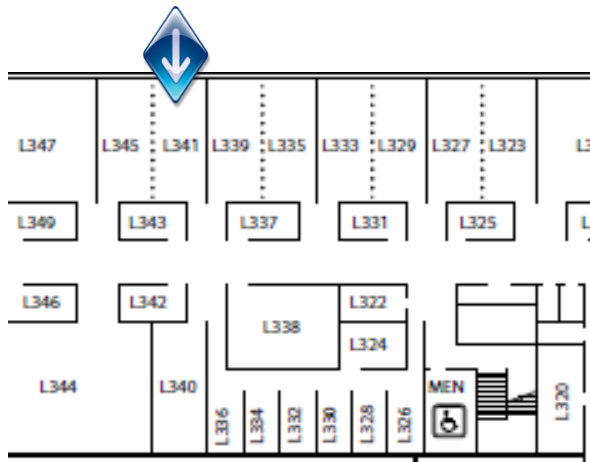

The comma splice

Using a comma between two complete sentences causes a comma splice.

Example: She could stand it no longer, she had to quit. **Comma splice.**

Example: The sharks began to circle the rubber raft, the men panicked. **Comma splice.**

To correct a comma splice, replace the comma with a semicolon, replace the comma with a period, or keep the comma and link the two sentences with “Fan Boys.”

Example: She could stand it no longer; she had to quit.

Example: She could stand it no longer. She had to quit.

Example: She could stand it no longer, so she had to quit.

FAN BOYS: for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so.
